	Ouote Significance

Significance is almost the same as importance. The significance of a quote is how the quote is relevant to the play (or story), the events, the setting, etc., and how it helps the reader's view of the story. **IT IS NOT THE MEANING OF THE QUOTE**.

How do you determine the significance?

Here are three steps to help you do that.

## 1. <u>Determine who said the quote.</u>

## 2. <u>Determine where and when the quote was said.</u>

## 3. Then use these questions to help analyze the significance.

- a. Does the quote give you new information about the setting or events of the story that you weren't aware of before?
- b. Does the quote tell you something about a character that you weren't aware of before?
- c. Is the quote a moment in the story where the events or circumstances change? How does the quote relate to it?
- d. Is the quote a moment in the story where a character's fate is determined?
- e. Is the quote a moment in the story where a character is trying to do something very important? What is it? Why is the quote related to that?
- f. How is the meaning of the quote important in the larger picture of the story?

\*\*\*\*\* If you use these three steps you should be able to determine why a quote is important to the story. Remember to always ask yourself WHY IS THIS QUOTE IMPORTANT IN THE STORY?
