A Scrapbook Review – Your Holocaust Book

People keep scrapbooks to remind them of important people, places, and events in their lives. They often include some of the following: pictures of loved ones or favorite places, ticket stubs, small objects, favorite things, notes from friends, journal entries, poems, brochures, newspaper articles, badges, emblems, invitations, letters and announcements. People may include just about anything that is important to them and that can be glued in! It is more than simply a photo album as it is part memory book, part picture book, and part a collection of mementos.

Your group task is to make a scrapbook for a main character in your book. Real victims of the Holocaust probably would not be allowed to have such a book as they were often stripped of all their personal possessions and even their names. Imagine what such a book might include if it were the only thing the character was allowed to keep.

You will be asked to present and explain your scrapbook to the class. Plan your presentation so that each member of the group will speak to the class.

You will be graded using a rubric.

Your scrapbook must have:

- As many pages as members of your group
- Each page must have a minimum of ten items
- Each item must have a short explanation of what the item is underneath it
- The look of a scrapbook from the time period (no computer type outs or printings)
- Front cover that includes the character's name and title of the novel
- Back cover must list names of members and the page they created
